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#### **Integrity Pact**

Sarva Haryana Gramin Bank, a Regional Rural Bank body constituted
after amalgamation through Gazette Notification dated 29.11.2013 issued by the Government of India (Bank).

#### Preamble

In order to achieve these goals, the Principal will appoint Independent External Monitors(IEMs)who will monitor the tender process and the execution of the contract for compliance with the principles mentioned above.

### Section 1- Commitments of the Principal

- (1) The Principal commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption and to observe the following principles:
- a. No employee of the Principal, personally or through family members, will in connectionwith the tender for, or the execution of a contract, demand, take a promise for or accept, for self or third person, any material or immaterial benefit which the person is not legallyentitled to. b. The Principal will, during the tender process treat all Bidder(s) with equity and reason. The Principal will in particular, before and during the tender process, provide to allBidder(s) the same information and will provide to any Bidder(s) confidential/additional information through



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GAD, Head Office, SHGB Bhawan, Plot No.1, Sector-3, Rohtak-124001 which the Bidder(s) could obtain anadvantage in relation to the tender process or the contract execution.

- C. The Principal will exclude from the process all known prejudiced person.
- (2) If the Principal obtains information on the conduct of any of its employees which is a criminal offence under the IPC/PC Act, or if there be a substantive suspicion in this regard, the Principal will inform the Chief Vigilance Officer and in addition can initiate disciplinary actions.

## Section 2- Commitments of the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s)

- (1) The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) commit themselves to take all measures necessary to prevent corruption during any stage of bid process/contract. The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) commit themselves to observe the following principles during participation in the tender process and during the contract execution.
- a. The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) will not, directly or through any other person or firm, offerpromise or give to any of the Principal's employees involved in the tender process or the execution of the contract or to any entitled to, in order to obtain in exchange any advantage of any kind whatsoever during the tender process or during the execution of the contract.
- b. The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) will not enter with other Bidders into any undisclosed agreement or understanding, whether formal or informal. This applies in particular toprices, specifications, certifications, subsidiary contracts, submission or non-submission of bids or any other actions to restrict competitiveness or to introduce cartelization in the bidding process.
- C. The Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) will not commit any offence under the relevant IPCIPC Act, further the Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) will not use improperly, for purposes of competitionorpersonal gain, or pass on to others, any information or document provided by the Principal as part of the business relationship, regarding plans., technical proposal and business details, including information contained or transmitted electronically.
- and address of the Agents/representatives in India, if any, Similarly the Gabidder(s)/Contractor(s) of IndianNationality shall furnish the name and address of the foreign principals, if any. Furtherdetails as mentioned in Guidelines on Indian Agents of Foreign Suppliers" shall be disclosed



GAD, Head Office, SHGB Bhawan, Plot No.1, Sector-3, Rohtak-124001 all thepayments made to the Indian agent/representative have to be in Indian Rupees only.

- e The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) will, when presenting their bid, disclose any and allpayments made, is committed to or intends to make to agents, brokers or any otherintermediaries in connection with the award of the contract.
- f. Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) who have signed the Integrity Pact shall not approach the Courtswhile representing the matter to IEMs and shall wait for their decision in the matter.
- (2). The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) will not instigate third persons to commit offences outlinedabove or be an accessory to such offences.

Section-3 Disqualification from tender process and exclusion from future contracts.


If the Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) before award or during execution has committed a transgressionthrough a violation of Section 2, above or in any other form such as to put their reliability orcredibility in question, the Principal is entitled to disqualify the Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) from the tender process or take action as per the procedure mentioned in the "Guidelines on Banning of business dealings".

## Section 4-Compensation for Damages

- (1). If the Principal has disqualified the Bidder(s) from the tender process prior to the awardaccording to Section 3, the Principal is entitled to demand and recover the damages equivalent to carnest Money Deposit/Bid Security.
- (2). If the Principal has terminated the contract according to Section 3, or the Principalisentitled to terminate the contract according to Section 3, the Principal shall be entitled todemand and recover from the Contractor liquidated damages of the contract value or the amount equivalent to Performance Bank Guarantee.

## Section 5- Previous transgression

(1) The Bidder declares that no previous transgression occurred that last three yearsimmediate before signing of this integrity pact with any other Company in any countryconforming to the anti-carrigade approach or with any Public Sector Enterprises orcentral state government department in India that could justify his exclusion from the form



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(2). If the Bidder makes incorrect statement on this subject, he can be disqualified from thetender process or action can be taken as per the procedure mentioned in Guidelines on Banning of business dealing.

## Section 6-Equal treatment of all bidders/ Contractors/ Subcontractors

- (1) In case of Sub-contracting, the Principal Contractor shall take the responsibility of theadoption of integrity Pact by the Sub-contractor. (2) The Principal will enter into agreements with identical conditions as this one with all Bidders and Contractors.
- (3) The Principal will disqualify from the tender process all the Bidders who do not sign this Pact or violate its provisions.

Section 7- Criminal charges against violating bidder(s)/Contractor(s)/Subcontractor(s)

If the Principal obtains knowledge of conduct of a Bidder, Contractor or Sub contractor, or of an employee or a representative or an associate of a Bidder, Contractor or Subcontractorwhich constitutes corruption, or if the Principal has substantive suspicion in this regard, the Principal will inform the same to the Chief Vigilance Officer.

#### Section 8- Independent External Monitor

- (1) The Principal appoints competent and credible Independent External Monitor for this Pactafter approval by Central Vigilance Commission. The task of the Monitor is to reviewindependently and objectively, whether and to what extent the parties comply with the obligations under the agreement.
- (2) The Monitor is not subject to instructions by the representatives of the parties and performs his/her functions neutrally and independently. The Monitor would have access to all Contract documents, whenever required. It will be obligatory for him/her to treat theinformation and documents of the Bidders/Contractors as confidential. He/she reports to the Chairman, Sarva Haryana Gramin Bank.

The Bidder(s)/Contractor(s) accepts that the Monitor has the right to without restriction to all project documentation of the Principal including that provided by the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s). The Grades of the Principal including that provided by the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s). The Grades of the Principal including that provided by the Bidder(s)/ Contractor(s) will also grant the Monitor, uponhis/her request and demonstration of a valid interest, unrestricted and unconditional contractor.



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- (4) The Monitor is under contractual obligation to treat the information and documents of the Bidder(s)/Contractor(s)/Subcontractor(s) with confidentiality. The Monitor has also signeddeclarations on 'Non-Disclosure of Confidential Information' and of 'Absence of Conflict of Interest'. In case of any conflict of interest arising at a later date, the IEM shall inform the Chairman, Sarva Haryana Gramin Bank and recues himself/herself from that case.
- (5) The Principal will provide to the Monitor sufficient information about all meetings amongthe parties related to the Project provided such meetings could have an impact on the contractual relations between the Principal and Contractor. The parties offer to the Monitorthe option to participate in such meetings.
- (6) As soon as the Monitor notices, or believes to notice, a violation of this agreement, he/shewill so inform the Management of the Principal and request the Management todiscontinue or take corrective action, or to take other relevant action. The monitor can inthis regard submit non-binding recommendations. Beyond this, the Monitor has no right to demand from the parties that they act in a specific manner, refrain from action

  or tolerateaction.
- (7) The Monitor will submit a written report to the Chairman, Sarva Haryana Gramin Bank within 8to 10 weeks from the date of reference or intimation to him by the Principal and, shouldthe occasion arise, submit proposals for correcting problematic situations. (8) If the Monitor has reported to the Chairman, Sarva Haryana Gramin Bank, a substantiated Suspicion of an offence under relevant IPC/PC Act, and the Chairman , Sarva Haryana Gramin Bank has not, within the reasonable time taken visible action to proceed against such offence or reported to the Chief Vigilance Officer, the Monitor may also transmit this information directly to the Central Vigilance Commissioner.
- (9) The word 'Monitor' would include both singular and plural.

### Section 09- Pact Duration

This Pact begins when both parties have legally signed it. It expires for the Contractor 12months after the last payment under the contract, and for all other Bidders 6 months after the contract has been awarded. Any violation of the same would entail disqualification of the bidders and exclusion future business dealings.

- (2) The actions stipulated in this Integrity Pact are without prejudice to any other legal actionthat may follow in accordance with the provisions of to the extant law in force relating to any civil or criminal proceedings.
- (3) Changes and supplements as well as termination notices need to be made in writing. Sideagreements have not been made.
- (4) If the Contractor is a partnership or a consortium, this agreement must be signed by allpartners or consortium members.
- (5) Should one or several provisions of this agreement turn out to be valid, the remainder ofthis agreement remains valid. In this case, the parties will strive to come to an agreement to their original intentions.
- (6) Issues like warranty/Guarantee etc. shall be outside the purview of IEMs.
- (7) In the event of any contradiction between, the Integrity Pact and its Annexure, the Clausein the Integrity Pact will prevail.
